

What We Do

Habitat Acquisition and Preservation GHAS has acquired over 3,000 acres of sensitive wildlife habitat for protection and preservation.

Conservation

In collaboration with Audubon Washington and other chapters, GHAS keeps abreast of local, regional and national conservation issues such as clean air, water quality, wetland and habitat protection and preservation.

Damon Point, Ocean Shores – Snowy Plover nesting area and shorebird viewing.


